This step not only provides greater safety, but it also makes your wedding very private, exclusive, and much more memorable for you.

### BE FLEXIBLE.

There are going to be issues especially during these remaining days of the Covid-19 pandemic. But that does not mean your wedding is a bust, you just need to be creative and think outside the box. When issues or problems come up, talk to the venue coordinator and find alternatives. Don't get locked into "must-haves".

### HIRE A PLANNER.

Most wedding venues, like here at Blame Her Ranch, have a manager or point person in charge. But, spend the extra money and hire a wedding planner who can oversee the most important wedding details, and this will allow you to enjoy your big day more. To keep costs down, you can hire "day-of-event planners".
