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New Mexico

Larger families or groups will want to check out [Blame Her Ranch](#) in Ribera, New Mexico. The entire property is yours to explore because when you rent the ranch house you are the only group staying. The ranch house sleeps up to 24 guests and has 8.5 bathrooms, a game room loft, an outdoor kitchen with a pizza oven, floating gardens and decks, and a huge lawn. Blame Her Ranch also has the only cauldron hot tub in the country. Rates average around \$4,300 per night for a multi-night stay. Dividing that up between families will help take the shock out of the price tag, too.

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
