- 5. Traditional Indian Wedding Attire: A Lehenga is traditional Indian attire worn for wedding celebrations. Unlike western wedding ceremonies, brides avoid wearing white, as it's a symbol of mourning. Instead, they opt for a colorful sari that reflects their region of origin. Typically, shades of red are popular colours as they represent happiness and good luck to the married couple.
